

A Message from the President: By Jeffery Flaws

The Village's current recreation director has resigned and the Park Commission and Village Board are looking at options to run the Village's recreational soccer program going forward. Unfortunately, this has left the impression with some that we are considering ending Village-sponsored soccer altogether. Our intent is NOT to end the program, but to explore how best to manage the administrative aspects, keeping in mind that its purpose is to provide an enjoyable recreational experience for ALL participants. As always, we will continue to use this newsletter, the Village's website, the coverage of Village activities as reported in the *Kettle Moraine Index*, and the postings of our various agendas to keep you informed as 2012 progresses. Park Commission

It has become increasingly difficult to operate the Village's soccer program using the same model as in the past. Populating the teams fairly, dealing with late registrations, securing coaches, trying to add numbers or split teams to create manageable rosters, and the myriad details required in dealing with the WYSA state organization and local league have taken more time than has been available for a part-time director. In addition, the Park Commission itself is in need of additional members to help oversee the soccer, baseball and the flag football programs, operate the parks and plan for their future.

Joining the KM United *recreational* program has been discussed as a potential option going forward. At a recent Park Commission meeting a group of parents expressed their concern about that possibility and asked that we consider keeping the program within the Village's administration. For the reasons cited above, that is not possible without increased participation from community members/parents. That participation would require at least one individual willing to become a member of the Commission and participate in ALL its activities, not just the soccer program. The Commission meets monthly and is responsible for oversight of the recreational programs and park maintenance, and preparing and administering budgets. Retaining Village supervision of the soccer program will also require a subcommittee of 2 to 3 people to assist the Commission with its administrative details—team assignments, recruiting coaches, league liaison, etc.

VILLAGE OF WALES BURNING ORDINANCE

BURNING REGULATIONS

RESIDENTIAL BURNING. Burning of garbage and trash prohibited. No person shall burn garbage, paper, putrid materials, buildings or other structures, lumber, construction materials, or materials from razed buildings. The burning of dry brush, dry leaves, dry limbs, dry plant clippings, dry branches and dry logs is allowed subject to various regulations as listed in the Village's current burning ordinance. Burning days are as follows:

November 15 – March 15

Days: Everyday

Hours: 8:00 a.m. – sunset

March 16 – November 14

Days: Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday

Hours: 8:00 a.m. – sunset

National Holidays: No burning

Burning on any commercial, business or other property within the Village, except for residential, is hereby prohibited.

Proof of a rabies shot is needed, including date of shot and its expiration date. Please fill out the application above and bring or send it along with your rabies certificate.

You must include a self-addressed, stamped envelope when paying by mail for the return of your license certificate, proof of rabies shot and license.

Building Inspection/Permits



As a rule of thumb, any work of a maintenance nature will not require a permit. However, building, remodeling, alterations or additions thereto, roofing, heating, air-conditioning, plumbing, electrical work, swimming pools, installation of wood burning heating systems, fences, decks, sheds, outbuildings, etc., will require a permit. Snowplowing Season is Just Around the Corner

Reminder: Village Ordinances prohibit snow from private properties being plowed across or onto Village right-of-way. If you do either you may be issued a citation and/or assessed cleanup costs.



Markers


If you wish to install snowplow markers on your property please adhere to the following guidelines: the markers must be flexible and/or breakaway (usually plastic or fiberglass). They should be set 10 to 20 feet apart. Metal stakes are NOT allowed. The Village is not responsible for any damage to private markers placed in the Village right-of-way.

Mailboxes

The Village is not responsible for mailboxes that are damaged by snow load or ones that were already loose and knocked over by snow load. Check your mailbox and repair any loose, damaged or inadequately anchored ones. If the snowplow contractor hits your mailbox, please report it promptly to the Village Hall so that we can look into the damage.

Miscellaneous Items

The Village is not responsible for and will not replace underground sprinkler heads, lamp posts or other obstacles located in the Village’s right-of-way if damaged during normal plowing operations.
