## Building Inspection/Permits

As a rule of thumb, any work of a maintenance nature will not require a permit. However, building, remodeling, alterations or additions thereto, roofing, heating, air-conditioning, plumbing, electrical work, swimming pools, installation of wood burning heating systems, fences, decks, sheds, outbuildings, etc., will require a permit. ## Severe Weather Safety Tips

Purchase a severe weather radio; they are not expensive (around \$30.00 – \$50.00).

Have a plan in case of the approach of severe weather, practice the plan and make sure you have the correct supplies—flashlights, portable radio, water, etc.

If your electricity goes out please DO NOT USE candles to light rooms. Use flashlights—check them now before you need them and have spare batteries on hand.

If you have a generator, make sure to run your generator outside and not in the house, gasoline powered generators give off carbon monoxide (CO).



## Removal of Noxious Weeds

Pursuant to State Law and Local Ordinances any person owning, occupying or controlling land shall destroy all noxious weeds on the land. If the weeds are not destroyed the Village will have said weeds destroyed and place the charge on the tax bill for collection. If you have any questions about identifying a noxious weed, please feel free to contact us. We have a listing from the State. Also, as a reminder, grass needs to be less than six inches in height as required by Village Ordinances.



## Burning Ordinance



Burning is prohibited when winds are 15 mph or more and on National Holidays. Burning is permitted during these periods:

**November 15 – March 15:** Every day, 8 a.m. to sunset.

**March 16 – November 14:** Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, 8 a.m. to sunset.



## Rain Barrels Reduce Runoff!

Lawn and garden watering can make up nearly 40 percent of total household water use during the summer. A rain barrel collects water and stores it for when you need it to water plants, wash your car or add to a swimming pool. The rainwater stored in the barrel contains no chlorine, lime or calcium—it is naturally “soft” water. A single rain barrel will save most homeowners about 1,300 gallons of water during the peak summer months. Saving water not only saves you money and energy, but it helps our environment. Diverting water from becoming runoff into our rivers and streams means less water needs to be pumped out of shrinking aquifers. We can all do a better job of managing the water that falls on our homes, yards, driveways and parking lots. When rain washes across land, it picks up pollution along the way and gives it a ride to the nearest waterway in most cases. Polluted runoff is the biggest remaining threat to water quality in the United States. By installing a rain barrel you can help reduce the polluted runoff. You can purchase a rain barrel through the Village for \$45.00. The barrel has a capacity of 55 gallons, is 23 inches in diameter and 36 inches tall. Please contact the Village Hall at 968-3968. Rain barrels must be paid for in advance.



## What's in Your Water??

Have you had your well tested lately? Radon gas is a natural occurring gas that is second most common cause of lung cancer among non-smokers. The EPA states an acceptable indoor level is about 4pci/L. Guidelines recommend it be done at least once every two years. Test information and a free kit are available at the Village Hall. Testing is done through Waukesha County Parks and Land Use. A \$25.00 fee is charged when you drop off the sample.

## Parking Regulations



**Night parking restricted.** No person shall park any vehicle on any Village street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m.

**Tractor-trailer parking.** No tracker or trailer shall be parked on any Village street except for loading or unloading purposes.

**Large vehicle parking.** Except as otherwise permitted under the terms of the Village Code, no residential property shall be used for parking motor vehicles weighing more than 8,500 pounds or having a length greater than 30 feet except for recreational vehicles, which are regulated in Chapter 17 of Zoning Code for the Village of Wales and cannot be parked or stored in the street yard or parked in the driveway serving the residence for longer than 72 hours.

**Parking in front yard in residential district.** No parking or storing of any motor vehicle, boat, or trailer in the required front yard area of any residential district except upon a driveway providing access to a garage, carport or rear yard parking area. Any vehicle parked within the front yard on a driveway shall be parked in such a manner as to maintain all wheels on a driveway surface.

**Parking on terraces (grassy area between sidewalk and roadway).** No owner of any vehicle, boat, trailer or other equipment shall park or store such vehicle, boat, trailer or other equipment on any terrace in the Village except in those places where the Village Board has authorized the removal of such terrace for the purpose of parking.

# Recycling

Please recycle your bottles and cans in our recycling bins located around the Village parks. Recycling helps keep our parks clean and our costs down. Every time you recycle, you contribute to the community rebate we receive for recycling in Wales.

**Yard Waste – Six (6) Collections per year.** Advanced Disposal Services offers the following guidelines for the proper preparation of yard waste materials: grass clippings, leaves, garden debris and small twigs are to be contained in **brown paper biodegradable yard waste bags** (available at most hardware and discount stores), or in **unlined 32-gallon garbage cans** with handles. Boxes are not acceptable containers. Brush, (branches no larger than 6" in diameter), must be tied in bundles not to exceed four feet in length and 1½ feet in diameter. Twine must be able to support the weight of the material. Bags, bundles or cans may not weigh more than 50 pounds each. **Plastic bags are not acceptable yard waste containers.**
